The pastoral search committee met with **Rev. Lev Reynolds**, Search Consultant for the Illinois South Conference, on Wednesday evening, January 25th,

2012. **Rev. Reynolds** worked with our search committee for over two hours training us on reviewing candidate profiles and answering some questions. We will begin receiving profiles to review from candidates who express an interest in our church. Due to required confidentiality, we are not able to share any of their information. Please respect our work, the confidentiality of the committee, and be patient with our progress. Keep the search committee members in your prayers as we seek God's special shepherd / minister for St. Peter UCC.

As chairman, I am asked questions regarding St. Peter having a full-time pastor. On behalf of the committee, I want to address this question. Every member of St. Peter deserves to know the answer.

**Rev. Howard Self** was our last full-time minister. When **Rev. Self** departed, St. Peter entered into a yoke agreement with Zion UCC. St. Peter began having a part-time / half-time minister at that time under the yoke agreement. We began a new era at St. Peter with a part-time minister who worked 20 - 25 hours weekly . We no longer have a yoked ministry with Zion UCC and have continued with two part-time interim ministers since 2009. With our continued decrease in members, both active and inactive; a decrease in worship attendance; and our church budget, Financial Plan for Ministry; the search committee is limited to considering only a part-time or bivocational minister. I hope that this clarifies the answer for those members asking about St. Peter having a full-time minister.

I will keep you updated on the progress of this committee.

I recently read an article that began by saying that a visioning process for a church is useless.

Developing a mission plan? Also useless.  
Creating a 5 or 10 year plan? A waste of time.

Gets your attention, doesn't it? We have always believed these things to be vital to the health of a church. Truthfully, they are. The congregation needs to develop a vision for the future and have a plan for how they will get there.

The part that is useless is attempting any of it without asking for the Spirit of God to be with the

church.

1. What is it that God intends for us to do and to be? It's not about what the pastor wants or what the council wants. A church needs to discern the mission God has in mind for it.

What does God want St. Peter UCC to be & to do?

This then, is not about daydreaming that we'd like to have the sanctuary full every Sunday morning, or that we want children overflowing from the classrooms on the main and upper floors. It is about asking God:

- Who should we be in mission to?
- What age group should we be targeting to invite?
- Where should we be holding worship? . . .
- What can we be offering to the community?

5. How are we going to get there? That 5 or 10 year plan comes into play here. To achieve a goal one needs to know what steps to take this year and the next to achieve the desired result. But, again, it's useless without asking God to be involved.

Paul wrote to the church in Corinth about church growth:

"I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labor of each. For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building."

I have a challenge for everyone reading this: Pray for the church every day. Pray for God's direction and guidance and strength for St. Peter UCC. Pray for God to show us where we should be and what we should be doing, and then guide us so that we can achieve the goals. Have God show us how to plant and how to water, and ask God to provide growth.

Take the calendar page of this newsletter and post it where you will see it. If you see the choir is practicing that evening, pray for the choir. If the administration team is meeting, pray for their work. Say extra prayers for the search committee, and pray for the pastor.

Without God's help, St Peter will not achieve much. With God's help, nothing is impossible.

The **Rev. Dr. Richard D. Weiss** observes that being stewards in the household of God is intensely counter-cultural in significant ways. We live in a society where we are taught explicitly and implicitly that to be truly human is to be self-sufficient, independent, protective, competitive, acquisitive, accumulative, a consumer. If you pay money, you should get something. There is no limit to the satisfaction of our desires. Our spirit is nourished and our worth is measured by what we possess. What are the marks of this counter-culture, the Household of God? We are interdependent and collaborative – we need each other, others need us. We share surplus so each has enough. In order for all to live, each limits accumulation. Money is just another resource to be allocated to ensure shalom. Our spirit is nourished by living up to who God made us to be. Our worth is given by God. Churches have a unique ministry opportunity to liberate members to order their financial life according to their faith values. **Laura Dunham** wisely notes in *Graceful Living*: “Every choice we make to spend, save, or give has an impact, creating a ripple effect. How each of us decides to live matters.”

### **TABLES AND CHAIRS!!!**

I am on a mission to get white tables downstairs and some new chairs. It has gotten to a point that **Todd** is having a very hard time handling the wooden tables and the ladies are having an even harder time if they need to move them. The goal is 20 tables and 20 new chairs, the old folding chairs are breaking and not being replaced we may not have enough for any large meals we may have.

After doing some research the following is the information I have found.

#### **Tables**

**Ace:** 8 ft. Living Accents Rectangular Tables \$79.99/ea no shipping charges because the tables are sent to the local Ace, but after talking to management they are willing to deliver to the basement of the church at no charge. The church already has an account.

**Sam's Club:** 8 ft. Lifetime Table \$105.75/ea shipping charge is included in price, but will only deliver to the church someone will need to be here to

unload from the truck, they only deliver they do not unload. Currently no church account with Sam's Club.

**Lowe's:** 8 ft Style Selection \$74.98/ea, shipping is \$59.00 to the building. Not available in white, only mocha powder. Church does not have an account with Lowe's.

### **Chairs:**

**Ace:** Cosco Steel Cushioned Folding Chair – 4 pack - \$123.96/4, no delivery charge will deliver to church and bring to the basement.

**Sam's Club:** Cosco Steel Cushioned Folding Chair – 4 pack - \$79.88/4 will deliver to church but will not unload the truck, delivery only.

**Lowe's:** Style Selection Padded Folding Chair- \$18.97/ea plus \$59.00 delivery charge to the church.

When comparing the information Ace is our best deal, we already have an account, and they will deliver and unload to the basement of the church.

If you are interested in buying a few tables and/or chairs, please let me know. These items are not in the budget and with the current financial situation I am trying to find people who are willing to finance this challenge. This is something that needs to be done if we want to continue to have meals served at the church. If you are interested in supporting this, all you have to do is give the church the money and the order will be placed, no need to buy the items yourself.

Your consideration and continued support in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Please help save the home of over 275 developmentally disabled persons in Southern Illinois!

The recent proposal by **Gov. Pat Quinn** to cut the Illinois State budget includes the possible closing of the Warren G Murray Developmental Center in

Centralia, IL. This facility is the home to over 275 developmentally disabled individuals (many of whom have lived at the facility for 30 to 40 years).

Now is the time we can stand together to support these individuals. Please take the time to sign the following petition (started by a member of the UCC and Centralia native) urging the Legislature and Governor to keep this facility open.
