
Their thank you notes from both follow below.

This is a great opportunity to give back to DuBois Center, a place that has touched so many lives in our community. The summer season is coming to a close, but there are still plenty of fall activities for which camp needs to look its best. Come get a little dirty and share in the satisfaction that comes from donating your time and talents. Projects will vary depending on the weather and the skills of those involved, so if you have a skill, such as carpentry, let us know! Lunch, supplies, most tools and good company are all provided. The **DuBois Center's annual Fall Festival** will be held on **Sunday, October 6<sup>th</sup>** from 11:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. with many of the usual attractions continuing to hopefully attract a huge crowd of 4,000 plus. This is the major fund-raiser for the Center as budgeted to offset operating costs.

The "Country Store" will be located in the same spot by the Roadside Cottage, and the profits benefitting future campers and retreaters via scholarships too. However, the Dorcas Circle of St. Paul UCC Church-Nashville will be organizing the Country Store this year with the hopes of having many persons helping in that area from other churches. The DuBois Center Auxiliary-Boosters will conclude its ministry as a support organization for DuBois Center on November 10th -1:00 p.m. upon their 35th anniversary at the Original Springs Hotel in Okawville. (A-B members will receive relevant info later).

However, I sure hope that persons who previously contributed food/cash and/or worked on preparation days and/or for DuBois Center will continue doing so. A letter will be posted later on the bulletin board summarizing the Store's details.

Our church will host a “**Bagging/Pricing**” time on **Saturday, October 5th at 9:30 a.m.** in our church’s Fellowship Hall (just like what we have done before). All workers certainly welcomed as well as any food and/or cash donations.

If you are able to help in the Country Store during a specific time on 10/6, please let me know. I will gladly convey that to the coordinators. (I will be working the entire time at the Country Store as a consultant on the day of the Fall Festival). All of the Store’s profits will be designated for future camp/retreat scholarships.

Also, there is a need for a themed basket(s) to be entered into the Silent Auction at the Fall Festival in the Oak Lodge. All of this specific revenue is deposited into the General Fund of DuBois Center—the same source for all of the food, vendors, and recreational fees. Please help to promote the 37<sup>th</sup> anniversary of DuBois Center's Fall Festival. Let’s hope for nice weather!!

## JULY 15<sup>th</sup> COUNCIL MEETING SYNOPSIS

Present: **Jim White, Cathy Chontofalsky, David Stedelin, Susan White, Greg Reichenbacher, Rev. Lisa Hart, DiAnn Caraker.**

**Absent: Judy Reichenbacher and Edie Ruez.**

The meeting was opened by **President Jim White**.

**Jim W.** noted that there were two emergency repairs in July for air conditioning and plumbing repairs. Funds were removed from the endowments on May 20th to pay the balance of the building exterior work, as voted and approved by the congregation on March 10<sup>th</sup>. There was an additional withdrawal in July for **Rev. Hart's** contract and our OCWM for the second quarter of 2013 as previously approved by the congregation.

**David S.** compared the offerings against our expenses thus far and, for the year, we are about \$6,000 short. Starting in May, the financial report will reflect this comparison monthly.

The Constitution and Bylaws changes were discussed. A meeting to complete this was scheduled for the Council for August 24<sup>th</sup> at 9:00a.m. at the church.

The Council will need to formulate the 2014 budget at our scheduled September 9<sup>th</sup> meeting to present to the congregation at the October annual meeting. The Ministry Team council representatives were asked to review their budgets and have a proposal from their Ministry Team for the 2014 budget.

**Greg R.** took care of changing our utilities provider to get a better rate as approved in a special council meeting on May 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Thermostat settings were changed for **Rev. Lisa** and **Judy R's** offices to 77/78 degrees when they are here in the mornings due to the 80 degree setting is very sultry and stuffy in the offices.

The old flag pole that is no longer used was previously approved for removal at the November 2011 needs to be removed. The Council discussed removing it and **Jim** said he could do that and then the area could be made into a nice flower bed.

**Jim W.** reported that the leaks were repaired (hopefully) and that there is no longer any leaking in **Pastor Lisa's** office at this time.

A proposed change to the 2007 policy to the "Use of the Church Facilities by Non-Members" was presented and discussed. The 2007 policy only addressed weddings, so another form/policy was made by **Jim W.** and it was reviewed. Suggestions were that language needed to be added regarding cancellations and refunds. Suggestions will be presented at the next meeting.

The licensor requirements for copying music for the bulletins were discussed. There is a possible yearly fee for this including printing and/or enlarging. This was tabled and will be looked into so that we are doing things ethically.

#### **MINISTRY TEAM REPORTS:**

**Congregational Care:** The team voted to advertise in the Sentinel's Balloon Fest supplement page. It was noted that if the Grief Support Group needed anything, the team would take care of it. New members **Ken and Suzie Finke** were welcomed on June 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Missions:** Scholarship applications are available. Recipients will be decided at the August meeting after submission deadline. **Lisa** reported that an OCWM representative will come to the August 1<sup>st</sup> worship service to thank the congregation for our contributions.

**Property:** Yellow stripes were painted on the steps and the parking lot. Several maintenance issues arose such as the air-conditioning, plumbing in the basement ladies bathroom.

**Special Events:** Helpers are needed for Vacation Bible School for St. Peter's meal night on July 30th. Region 6 meeting will be held at St. Peter's on August 25th at 4pm. The team will make coffee and tea and others need to bring salads and desserts. **Lisa** and **Walt** will provide meat. Rally Day will be on September 8<sup>th</sup> with fellowship time. Educational team will be asked to help. Wurstmart will be held on October 20th with **Norma Borgmann** as chairperson.

**Stewardship:** An audit of the 2012 financial records of St. Peter was performed on May 23rd and it determined that procedures followed are proper.

**150th Anniversary Committee:** Anniversary bumper stickers are available for purchase. A banner is being planned to be made for the hallway and is still in design phase. The final anniversary celebration will be held on Sunday, October 13th. **Rev. Sheldon Culver**, conference minister, will be out guest minister for service. All guests and members will be invited for a potluck in the Fellowship Hall at noon. The committee is looking into having a speaker following the meal.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 9th at 6:30pm.
