ILLINOIS SOUTH CONFERENCE ANNUAL MEETING REPORT

The annual meeting of the Illinois South Conference was held October 24 and 25 at the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows in Belleville. Representing St. Peter UCC of Centralia were **Pastor Lisa Hart** and delegates **Norma Borgmann** and **Verna Steinkamp**. **Verna**, being on the Conference Gatherings Team, was quite busy with various duties. The day before, the group met at Concordia UCC and collated the folders in the morning and decorated at the Shrine in the afternoon. The group made over 100 dream catchers and suspended them from the ceiling to go with the theme "Imagine a Church...Dreaming with God." Near the end of the gathering they were offered to the group for a donation, and they were readily received. There were 168 delegates from the 81 churches in the conference present along with other non-voting individuals.

The keynote speaker was **Rev. Cameron Trimble** who was motivational in her remarks and addressed the group at three different times. Worship was held after lunch the first day at the Shrine church which included a mass choir and mass bell choir. **Verna** helped serve communion, and **Norma** helped collect the offering.

A first time wine and cheese reception hosted by ISC Pride was held at the Shrine Hotel at the end of the first day. The banquet was in the evening followed by entertainment in the form of Family Feud

with the families being the region groups. Over 100 people had been surveyed previously via internet, and the event was quite entertaining. The questions were quite simple such as: Name a hymn, an animal from the Bible, a book of the Bible in the Old Testament, etc.

The marketplace was open both days, and the 50th anniversary committee, who is planning events for the celebration of Illinois South Conference, performed a skit in which **Verna** and **Norma** participated. The event is to be May 3, 2015 at Grizzley Field, so mark your calendars!

More specific facts will be reflected in the annual report when they are distributed at the end of the year.
